The course is multidisciplinary and will cover fields such as Human Rights, Democracy, Research Ethics, Bioethics, Digital Sociology, Risk Analysis, Indigenous Perspectives, along with Youth and Cross-Cultural perspectives in relation to Artificial Intelligence.

The course includes the 10th annual international Conference for Navigating Knowledge Landscapes (NKL) [Centre-Periphery in the AI-Informed Digital Society](#) to be held in Trollhättan, Sweden on May 20-21, 2026. Ph.D. course and NKL conference continue to be free of charge.

Course Work

Abstract 250 words (to be submitted as part of registration to the course prior to online teaching).

Extended text, 500-750 words, to be distributed between colleagues. The extended text lays the ground for the oral presentation in the PhD training event.

Final text 2500-3000 words, on interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary aspects in the PhD students' own project. The final text is expected to include presentation, discussion and incorporation of recommended literature.

The course is developed as a collaboration between the NKL network and the Ph.D. programme [Digitalisation and Society](#) at Østfold University College, and department of informatics at University West.
